TIME TRAVELERS!

Lesson Title: Promises

<u>Main Point:</u> Kids will learn that God knows and cares about every detail of our lives.

Bible Verse: "I am the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and the End," says the Lord God. "I am the God Who is, and Who was, and Who will come. I am the Mighty One." Revelation 1:8



In the Car: Ask your child what we did at SNK. Hint: Our Time Travelers went back in time, way back in time, and met a guy named Abraham. (You may have heard of him.) In our story, Abraham believed God when he told him he would have a son. This is quite amazing because both Abraham and his wife, Sarai, were very old at the time God talked to him. They waited another 10 years, and eventually had a son named Isaac. And Isaac had children, and they had children, and on and on it went, until ultimately, Jesus was born into that family! God promised Abraham he would have so many descendants, it would be more than stars he could count in the sky! You can read about it in Genesis 15.

<u>Hanging Out:</u>: When you're hanging out this week, talk about the people who came before you in your family tree. You probably know your grandparents, or even great grandparents, can you go back further than that.? It would be fun to make a drawing of a family tree together to show your children how the family has grown over time. In the same way, Abraham's family grew and grew, generation after generation, knowing the one true God. And, in fact, since Jesus came and gave each of us the opportunity to be adopted into His family, we can ALL in a sense be called children of Abraham. Indeed, Abraham has more descendants than stars in the sky!

At Dinner: Here are some great discussion starters:-

- How many stars do you think there really are in the sky? Try googling it.
- God called Abram righteous because Abram trusted God. Is trusting God easy?
- What do you think the world will be like a hundred years from now, what will your grandchildren and great grandchildren possibly experience?

<u>At Bedtime:</u> Review the verse at the top of this page. Talk about how MIGHTY God is. In which ways are you glad you serve a God who is mighty? Ask your child if they have any prayer requests to talk to God about. Remind each other that God is Mighty. And He is capable of helping us with any troubles.

<u>Parent Insight:</u> The story of Abraham and Sarai can remind us of God's faithfulness through the long haul. Sometimes it feels like things take forever to come into reality. It could be a job, a home, a relationship, a skill, etc. And, yet, God is faithful to give us what He has promised.. As Abraham believed God for a son, and eventually millions upon millions of descendants, what are some things you are trusting God for? Is there something you believe God has for you in life, you just haven't experienced it yet? Continue to pray for God's leading and interaction in your life. Talk to your kids about the way you are trusting God and maybe you will see them develop this same kind of faithfulness in life.
